CALL FOR PAPERS

Cardiometabolic diseases such as obesity, diabetes, and cardiovascular diseases, major public health concerns, are multifactorial diseases caused by both environmental and genetic factors. Although recent genome-wide association studies have identified many loci related to aforementioned diseases, the identified variants explain only a small proportion of their heritability. Better understanding of the interplay between genetic and environmental factors such as diet and lifestyle is the basis for developing effective personalized prevention and management strategies. Therefore, we proposed this special issue to understand recent advances in identifying gene-environment interactions related to cardiometabolic diseases.

We hereby invite authors to submit their latest research for inclusion to this special issue, which will be published in Disease Markers (IF=2.137). We welcome all article types, including research articles as well as review articles. All submitted papers will undergo independent peer-review process.

Potential topics include but are not limited to the following:

- ▶ Gene-diet/lifestyle interaction on obesity, diabetes, and cardiovascular diseases and related biomarkers
- ▶ New methodological approaches for gene-diet interactions
- ▶ Mechanistic studies with gene-diet interactions
- ▶ Mendelian randomization analysis of cardiometabolic diseases and related biomarkers
