

## Corrigendum Corrigendum to "Role of Baicalin in Anti-Influenza Virus A as a Potent Inducer of IFN-Gamma"

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In the article titled "Role of Baicalin in Anti-Influenza Virus A as a Potent Inducer of IFN-Gamma" [1], there appears to be an image duplication in Figure 1, as raised on PubPeer [2]. In Figure 1(c), the panel showing the 100x + untreated mice inadvertently duplicated the panel showing the 100x + 2.0 g/kg BA-treated mice.

The corrected figure, as approved by the editorial board, is shown below.



FIGURE 1: Antiviral activity of BA in treating A/PR/8/34-infected mice. Mice were inoculated with virus intranasally and treated with BA at the indicated concentration every 24 h for 14 days. Each group consists of 10 mice. (a) Survival rate of mice was observed in the next two weeks.  $\blacktriangle$ : untreated mice;  $\boxdot$ : control A/PR/8/34-infected mice;  $\Delta$ : 1.0 g/kg BA-treated mice;  $\bigcirc$ : 1.5 g/kg BA-treated mice;  $\Box$ : 2.0 g/kg BA-treated mice. (b) Lungs of mice were homogenized separately, diluted, and centrifuged on the third, fifth, and seventh day after infection, and the EID<sub>50</sub>s were determined using 10-day chick embryo. (c) Lungs of mice were removed and examined pathologically using HE staining on the seventh day after infection. <sup>#</sup>Levels of significance of P < 0.05 against untreated mice; \*P < 0.05 against control infected mice;
