PAN AMERICAN CONGRESS OF GASTROENTEROLOGY – 2001

The next Pan American Congress of Gastroenterology will be held in Lima, Peru from October 29 to November 3, 2001. Plans are underway for a satellite meeting, cosponsored by CAG, to be held in Cuzco from October 26 to October 29. An excursion to nearby Machu Picchu will be included in the itinerary of the satellite meeting.

In order to encourage Canadian participation in the Pan American Congress, the CAG will provide up to 20 travel bursaries of \$1,000 each to CAG members who have an abstract accepted for presentation. The abstract deadline is June 30, 2001.
